



Linda Daniels has been responsible for planning, redevelopment and economic development strategies and overseeing their implementation for the City of Rancho Cucamonga since 1986. During her tenure with the City/Redevelopment Agency, Linda has directed or participated in the development of more than \$450 million in public improvement projects including the Civic Center and Public Safety facility, several fire stations, the City's public libraries, and many work force housing projects.

The robust efforts of the Redevelopment Agency continue to have a significant impact on the overall quality of life for residents, bringing about a noteworthy change in the general demographic profile. As a result of the Agency's activities, Rancho Cucamonga is no longer considered just a hub for distribution, logistics and transportation; the City is also one where Class A office space is setting records by leasing before completion with large nationally recognized companies. Over the years, the City has also seen an influx of tech, defense, aerospace and medical products companies that are doing both research and production.

Linda was directly involved with a highly successful public-private partnership, the Victoria Gardens Regional Town Center, which opened in 2004. This award-winning, 1.3-million-square-foot destination provides a wide range of shopping, dining, entertainment and cultural opportunities for the community and the region. The success of this partnership has further defined Rancho Cucamonga as *the* place to live, work and play in the Inland Empire.

Under Linda's leadership, the Redevelopment Agency has received numerous awards from the California Redevelopment Association (CRA), the California Association for Local Economic Development (CALED), and the City-County Communications and Marketing Association (3CMA) for Rancho Cucamonga's marketing and economic development programs.

Linda is a strong advocate of regional economic development efforts and serves on the Board of the Inland Empire Economic Partnership. As a resident of Rancho Cucamonga, she is active in local Girl and Boy Scout programs and she volunteers at local schools. Linda received a Master of Public Administration degree in 1992 from California State University, Northridge.
